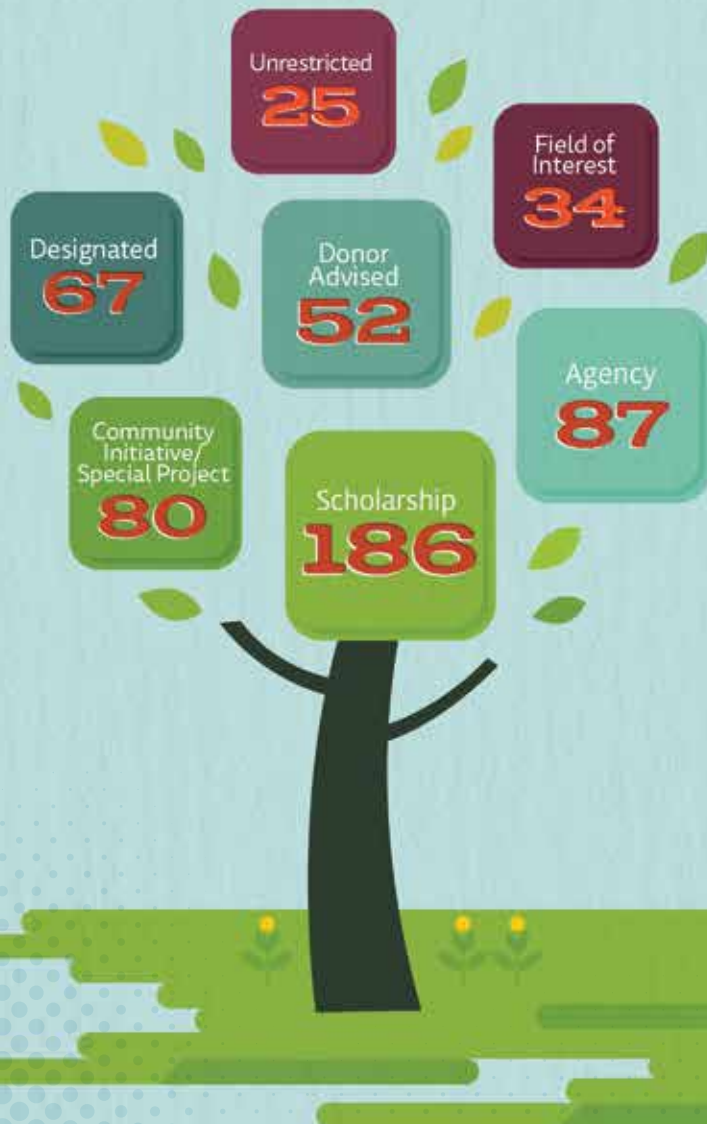
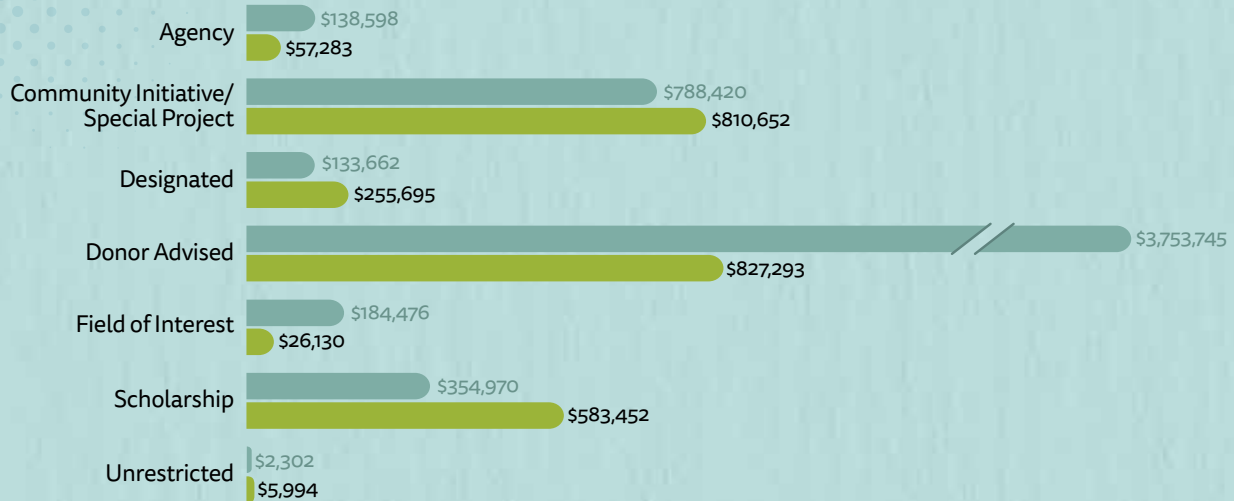

Through the Saginaw Community Foundation's grants distribution processes, we are able to provide financial support to enable these projects and programs throughout the entire county and the Great Lakes Bay Region.

During the 2016 Council of Michigan Foundations Annual Conference, members of the SCF staff and Board of Directors had the privilege of hearing a message from Dr. Robert Putnam, the Malkin Professor of Public Policy at Harvard University. In his book, *Our Kids, the American Dream in Crisis*, Dr. Putnam states that researchers have piled up evidence on the importance communities have on our well-being and opportunities for our children. He says, "Community bonds and social networks have powerful effects on health, happiness, educational success, economic success, public safety, and (especially) child welfare." In other words, it takes a community – our village – to take care of itself. With the help of many community partners and supporters, the Saginaw Community Foundation is committed to meeting the needs of and caring for our village.

For anyone who wants to get involved, our village is just the right size. By getting involved, and working together, many great things can be accomplished. SCF is the Chair of Alignment Saginaw, a community collaborative comprised of representatives from a variety of human service agencies from across the region focused on improving the lives of citizens in Saginaw County. SCF has learned first-hand via Alignment Saginaw that when a safe environment is provided where everyone has a voice, people are willing to come together to work collectively towards a common goal.

Over the past year, Alignment Saginaw members voiced their opinions to identify key areas they felt the membership should focus its attention. With the experts seated at the table, the group was confident they could make a difference by focusing on these key areas:

- 1 Transportation
- 2 Employment/skill development (with a high focus on the ex-offender population)
- 3 Cradle-to-Career education
- 4 Housing/Walk-to-Work opportunities

Alignment Saginaw members felt strongly that focusing on these areas would support the entire community, but especially those with overriding challenges and obstacles. In a short period of time, and by extending our partnerships, enhancements to public transportation were made.

Saturday hours were restored to bus routes, a transportation planner was hired, and SVSU students can now explore broader parts of the community via a new dedicated Night Line bus route from campus to Downtown and Old Town Saginaw. Also, over a 12-week period, 16 men with criminal backgrounds were given the opportunity to gain skills and become employable. And, interest is gaining among employers who want to assist employees with the purchase and management of homes within walking distance from their jobs. There are some exciting things happening in our community – our village – and we welcome everyone who wants to be part of the conversation.

More to come in 2017 and we look forward to working with you!

O.U.R. Saginaw

Imagine easily accessible kayak and canoe launches, woodland trails, and regularly programmed events for youth to play and learn in nature, all integrated into existing urban environments. A grant awarded last year to the Saginaw Basin Land Conservancy for its Outdoor Urban Recreation (O.U.R.) Saginaw hopes to transform vacant, neglected, or under-utilized spaces into portals for active outdoor recreation and learning.

Zachary Branigan, executive director of the Saginaw Basin Land Conservancy says, "These projects help leverage existing properties that currently eyesores or not being used to their full potential and create new, natural amenities in the City of Saginaw and surrounding areas."

The projects to be implemented as part of O.U.R. Saginaw include:

- **Restoration** of a 3-acre site along the Saginaw River adjacent to Saginaw Arts and Sciences Academy (SASA)
- **Expanding** woodland exploration opportunities via single-track trails on a 16-acre site adjacent to and owned by the Children's Zoo at Celebration Square
- **Pollinator plantations** across the City of Saginaw on vacant lots held by the Saginaw County Land Bank
- **A new nature trail project** through wetland areas on the north side of Saginaw Valley State University's campus

Thriving communities rely on their availability of and accessibility to a variety of outdoor activities like mountain biking, trail running, hiking, canoe and kayak paddling, birdwatching, and fishing. These are the types of amenities known to attract and retain families and help boost the local economy.

"This project is being supported by a wide variety of funders," said Branigan. "Receiving support from Saginaw Community Foundation is the last piece of the puzzle and validation that we are on the right path. It's just not possible to do successful community-based projects without involving SCF."

dorm expansion

The sounds. The woods. The wildlife. A simple mention of the name “Hartley” brings a smile to most faces with the memories of a first trip to the wooded outdoor education center located in St. Charles during elementary school.

“If you were a student in Saginaw County, coming to Hartley was an iconic part of your school experiences,” said Eric Rutherford, director, Hartley Outdoor Education Center.

Since 1975, Hartley Outdoor Education Center has become a true tradition and “rite of passage” for over 300,000 students from across the Great Lakes Bay Region and beyond. Each year, interest in using the facilities from schools here locally and from as far away as Farmington Hills continues to grow. Unfortunately, due to the space constraints in the dormitories, some schools must split their classes into two groups or not attend at all.

The dormitories were constructed in 1975 and have seen only basic maintenance over that time. The total capacity was 80 bunks (40 per side) between the boy’s and girl’s dorms. In order to accommodate the growing demand for space, an expansion of the dorms was needed.

Last year, a \$15,000 grant was awarded to assist with an expansion and renovation of the dorms, adding 20 bunks to each side. All of the original wooden bunks were replaced with new metal-framed bunks. New mattresses and carpet were added as well as energy-efficient lighting, new windows, new laundry facilities, and safety and security systems.

“Receiving support from Saginaw Community Foundation was huge,” said Rutherford. “Whenever you have a big project to do, working with the community foundation is the first step. This grant will live on for many years and impact every student that visits Hartley. It’s the best return on investment you can ever have.”

animal assistance

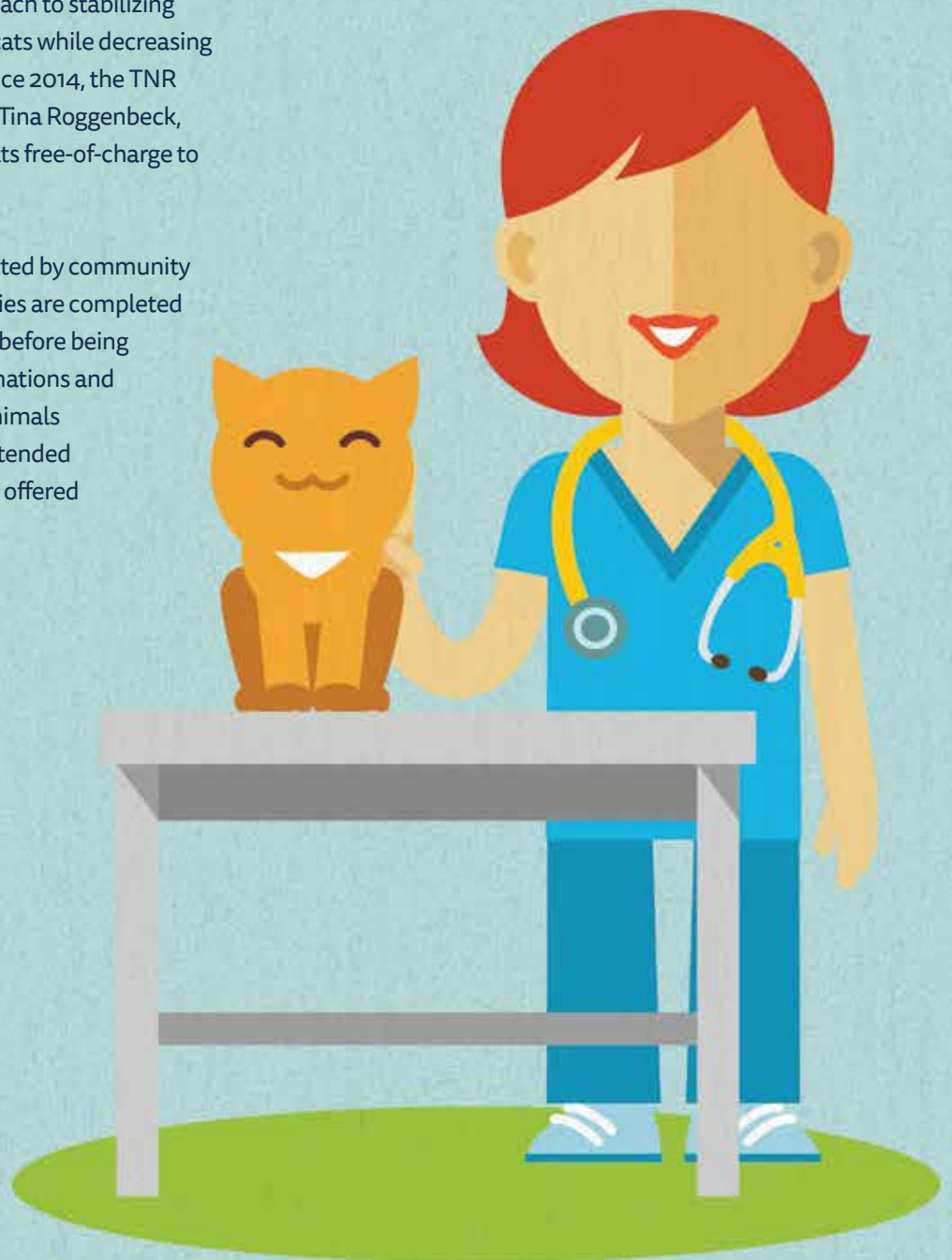
From a national perspective, most municipal animal shelters no longer have the means or the readiness to support the persistently high number of felines arriving at their facilities. Locally here in Saginaw County, our animal control shelter shares in these statistics. Annually, Saginaw County Animal Control Center admits more felines than they can humanely house or provide care for extended periods of time.

To help combat the issue of stray and homeless felines in Saginaw County, a new nonprofit agency, Angels Among Us, Inc., was established in 2014. Last year, Saginaw Community Foundation awarded a \$7,000 grant to Angels Among Us, Inc. for its Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) project.

TNR has been successfully practiced in hundreds of communities nationwide in every landscape and setting. It is a humane, non-lethal approach to stabilizing outdoor populations of community cats while decreasing euthanasia in municipal shelters. Since 2014, the TNR project in Saginaw County, led by Dr. Tina Roggenbeck, has sterilized and vaccinated 1,106 cats free-of-charge to county residents.

All animals are trapped and transported by community members seeking assistance. Surgeries are completed the same day the animal arrives and before being returned to their trap location, vaccinations and flea treatments are administered. Animals receiving services are never left unattended during the day and are awake, active, offered food and have eaten before release.

“Receiving this grant from SCF is a blessing to Angels Among Us, Inc., Saginaw residents, and most importantly, Saginaw’s homeless animals,” said Deirdre MacDonald, vice president, Angels Among Us, Inc. “Prior to receiving this grant, our organization was financially unable to offer both surgical and medical services to homeless animals within our community.”

open-air cinema



For the past 14 years, hundreds if not thousands of folks have been gathering in a parking lot in Old Town Saginaw on Sunday evenings during the summer. They bring blankets, chairs and even an occasional sofa to enjoy movies projected on a screen attached to the side of a building. The free event: The Lawn Chair Film Festival – the first of its kind in Michigan.

The audience is as varied as Saginaw itself, with young and old coming together with a mutual appreciation of community and motion pictures.

“We are an all-volunteer organization,” said Peter Brian Rose-Barry, secretary, Lawn Chair Film Festival.

Over the years, time has taken its toll on the equipment being used to host the event at 221 N. Hamilton St. in Old Town Saginaw.

“The screen was falling apart and our projection and sound equipment was terribly outdated,” said Rose-Barry.

That’s when the group turned to Saginaw Community Foundation for grant support to replace the screen and upgrade the A/V equipment.

“Without the grant support from SCF, the Lawn Chair Film Festival would have probably folded. We just did not have the funds for such an expense,” said Rose-Barry.

With support, the festival will be able to continue as a community summertime entertainment staple in Old Town Saginaw, bringing world-class movies to Saginaw that might not have otherwise been shown here.



vocational scholarships

Dreaming of a career in welding? Maybe managing your own auto mechanics garage fuels your thoughts or you would love to become an electrician. Perhaps studying to become a chef in a culinary arts program suits your tastes.

No matter what career path is chosen, there is little doubt that in recent years interest in vocational education – and helping support those seeking these degrees and certifications – has grown.



The increased need for workers skilled in the trades has resulted in larger numbers of students seeking out vocational and skilled trade education. Scholarships geared toward these career paths offered by Saginaw Community Foundation can be of assistance.

Trade schools encompass a wide variety of hands-on education, from HVAC to carpentry to cosmetology. In the past, financial assistance has been hard to come by for these areas of study, but that is no longer the case. Today, Saginaw Community Foundation has several scholarship opportunities for those who have the desire to attend trade school.

“Many people in our community are aware of our scholarships,” said LeeAnn Martuch, program officer at the Foundation. “But not many people know about scholarships we have that can be used for vocational training.”

Students from across Saginaw County, the state of Michigan or even other parts of the country use Foundation scholarships to pursue education beyond high school. They come from all walks of life and all areas.

Their backgrounds may be very different, but they all have one thing in common – the desire and the drive to achieve a higher education.

According to leading economists, not everyone needs a four-year degree. In fact, millions of good-paying jobs are opening up in the trades. And some pay better than what the average college graduate makes.

For aspiring welders, electricians, carpenters, and other valued skilled trade workers, opportunity is ripe to take advantage of tailored trade school programs. The demand is massive as an estimated 3 million trade jobs in the United States remain vacant.

“Society will always need electricians, mechanics, and other skilled tradespeople to keep things running smoothly,” said Martuch. “Thanks to our generous donors who have established various scholarship funds at Saginaw Community Foundation, we are able to help students fulfill their dream of a job in the trades.”

successful students

Youth First, Saginaw Community Foundation's after-school program, completed another successful school year in June. The program, housed at Saginaw Public School's Loomis Elementary, 2001 Limerick St., benefits low performing/low income students. Provided free-of-charge, the program aims to reinforce fundamentals learned during the school day in a fun, creative, safe and structured environment.

"We provide structure in the lives of the children we serve. Many of the kids come from difficult environments," said Tifani Autry, Youth First site coordinator. "Youth First is a safe place where kids can be kids. We are making a difference." In grades K-6, 38 students were served.



Field trips enrich learning

A part of the Youth First program is bringing in vendors to do fun, engaging, hands-on educational presentations. Also, field trips throughout the Great Lakes Bay Region take place.

Students attending Loomis Elementary and Youth First often only see the world from the few city blocks in and around their neighborhood. Many do not venture far from home or school.

"The field trips are an important part of the Youth First experience," said Debra Shelton, director. "Many times we visit places the students have never been to that most of us take for granted, like the Saginaw Art Museum or even a bowling center."

The enrichment activities have a direct benefit for the students. "It's all about raising and building up the spirits of these children. We know by experience, that when the children feel good about themselves, their grades and behaviors improve," said Shelton.

Reading program begins

Thanks to the United Way of Saginaw County, Youth First students were able to participate during the summer of 2016 in the LEXIA® Literacy Improvement Program, free-of-charge. The self-paced online literacy learning tool allows students to work at their own pace while being motivated by their successes in reading comprehension. The program has proven results nationwide with students of all reading levels. The education team at Youth First is excited to be able to offer this reading enrichment product to its students.

Bridging the Gap

Youth First students participated in the Bridge the Gap event, held in September, 2016 on the campus of Saginaw Valley State University. The event brings together police officers and the community on the basketball court. Youth First students not only enjoyed the event, but were also treated with a visit from a Michigan State Trooper at Loomis Elementary. The State Trooper spoke about the importance of building positive relationships through drama skits and group discussions.

Here are just a few of the enrichment activities Youth First students participated in during the 2015-16 school year:

- Building self-esteem
- Black History studies
- Etiquette
- Proper nutrition and fitness, led by Saginaw Valley State University and Saginaw YMCA
- Character education
- Anti-bullying
- STEM experiments with scientists from Midland-based Dow Chemical Company
- Goal setting
- Human anatomy
- STEM curriculum for girls provided by the Girl Scouts

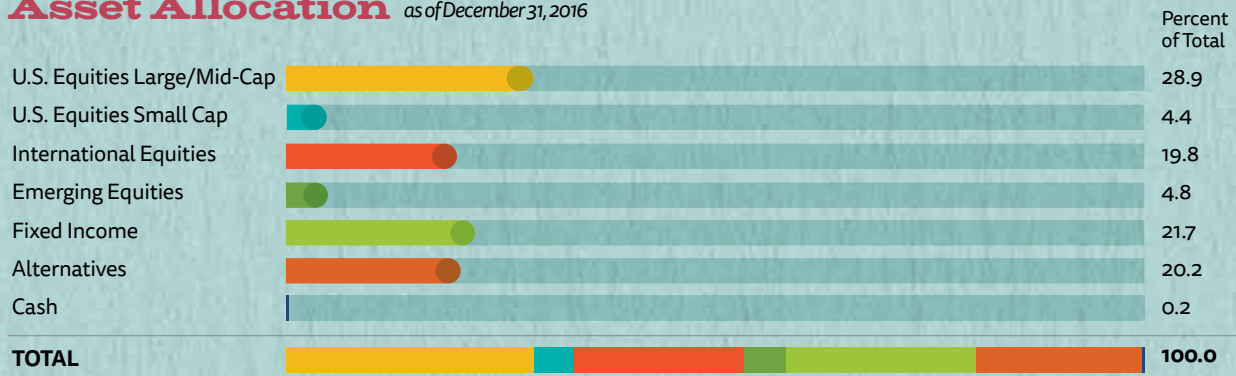

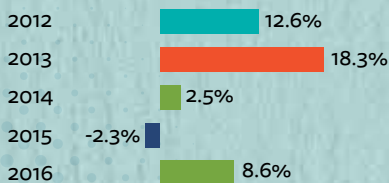
