Welcome back to our village! It's been another great year of community building and we have many great stories to share. Our village is that much stronger, and, that's exactly what we're going to share with you in our 2017 Saginaw Community Foundation Annual Report.

At the beginning of the year, the Saginaw Community Foundation Board of Directors embarked on a challenge of asking open-ended questions regarding the community we serve during Board meetings. These questions – centered around education, addressing poverty, and third grade reading proficiency to name a few – allowed board members to be more vested and engaged, and to have greater ownership of impacting change in Saginaw County. In 2018, we are going to continue asking these questions, and allow ourselves to dive deeper into the needs of our community, while still accomplishing the mission of our Foundation.

Last year also saw Saginaw Community Foundation select a neighborhood association in the City of Saginaw to implement a pilot program of Asset Based Community Development (ABCD). The goal of implementing the ABCD program was to better communicate with our residents, build capacity, establish trust, and encourage partnerships. Selection of the first neighborhood association participant was based upon interest, leadership, partnerships, and a strong anchor institution located in the neighborhood. After accepting and reviewing applications, Unity in the Community, a newly established neighborhood association, satisfied each of the criteria and was selected. Speaking of partnerships, no one would have expected United Kingdom-based nonprofit organization Girl Effect to land in Saginaw. Originally created and deployed in Northern Nigeria, Girl Effect's Technology Enabled Girl Ambassador (TEGA) program is designed to uncover insights about girls in some of the hardest to reach communities across the globe. Over the past few years, the program has been used in a variety of countries, however, the pilot program in Saginaw marks the first time the TEGA program has been used in a developed nation anywhere in the world.

Johnston (left) Smallwood Holoman, Jr. (right) After conducting a TEGA pilot during 2017, Girl Effect had a desire to continue their work in Saginaw and work with a consortium of agencies to further impact areas of concern that were uncovered by the Saginaw TEGA researchers. The TEGAs, whose ages range between 16-18, completed 10 rounds of research, conducted 350 interviews with men, women and young people, and collected over 6,000 video and audio clips. Through these peer-to-peer interviews, the Saginaw TEGAs learned that the greatest areas of concern young people in Saginaw have are:

- Sex Education (lack of)
- Safety
- Education
- 4 Mentors (lack of)
- Social Supports (awareness of)

Coming in 2018, as a result of the research conducted by the TEGAs, a local leadership team is being assembled to lead a network of researchers that will give these young Saginaw girls a voice. The goal of the research will be to strengthen local programs and create real-life impact. The time is now to listen to what our young people are telling us. Thank you to Girl Effect and their desire to work in Saginaw, and with the support of the SCF Board of Directors, that work will continue in 2018 and beyond.

It's always nice to know that we're not alone in our village. Of course, there are a number of amazing service organizations who provide a variety of supports, but there are also key leaders and influencers who make change happen. Throughout the year, we interacted with those influencers to see what they thought the Saginaw Community Foundation should be focused on and how we could all work together. In the recently published book New Power by Jeremy Heimans and Henry Timms, the authors state that "power" is the "ability to produce intended effects." They further state: "That ability is now in all of our hands. Today, we have the capacity to make films, friends or money; to spread hope or our ideas; to build community or build-up movements ..." They also explain the difference between old and new power. Old power works like currency. It is held by few. It is closed, inaccessible, and leader-driven. New power is made by many. It is open, participatory, and peer-driven. "The goal with new power is not to hoard it but to channel it."

In our village, let's continue to channel our energies together so we can produce "intended effects" in new and impactful ways.

GIRLS ON THE RUN SAGINAW BAY

From a young age, girls are exposed to a barrage of messages about image and conformity, often causing them to create standards for themselves and other girls that are unrealistic, unhealthy, and unattainable. Girls on the Run, designed for girls 3rd-8th grade, hits the target ages when children are still receptive to adult's influence, yet beginning to feel the pull of peer pressure.

At Girls on the Run Saginaw Bay, running is woven throughout all lessons, but the core of the program is all about building character. The Learner's Model is used which focuses on the "5 c's +1". The "c's" are Confidence, Competence, Caring, Connection, and Character with the plus-one Community.

"By building-up girls to be strong in these categories, the goal is that they will be more likely to give back to their community," said Jennifer Naegele, council director, Girls on the Run Saginaw Bay.

The curriculum being used, however, needed to be updated to help keep the lessons fresh, especially for returning participants. Grant funding from Saginaw Community Foundation in 2017 totaling \$2,857 was used to expand

the curriculum, support the annual 5K run, and improve outreach materials.

"Saginaw Community Foundation has been integral in our success, especially with the grant support for our new curriculum," said Naegele. "It has helped us create a sustainable, thriving, growing program."

Girls on the Run Saginaw Bay is making a difference in the communities it serves and in its participants. According to a recent survey, 85% of girls improved in areas of confidence, competence, caring, character, or connection. Girls who were the least active at the start of the season have increased physical activity by more than 40%.

"Girls participating are demonstrating greater confidence in their lives and leading physical, healthy lifestyles," said Naegele. "Girls on the Run Saginaw Bay is now starting to see some of our first participants return as junior coaches."

Since 2010, Girls on the Run Saginaw Bay has expanded across Saginaw County and now has programs in Arenac, Bay, and Tuscola Counties at 43 total sites serving approximately 2,100 participants. A typical season serves 300-400 girls.

"We're more than just a library. We're the hub of activity in the community," said BillieJo Bluemer, library director of Rauchholz Memorial Library in Hemlock.

Serving the Hemlock area since 1942, the Rauchholz Memorial Library – this hub of information, education programs, and community gathering – finds itself bursting at the seams.

"The current building was not originally designed as a library and it is no longer meeting the needs of our patrons," said Bluemer.

Oftentimes, due to multiple programming offerings, the library does not have quiet areas for studying or research. Also, tutors working with students are sometimes turned away due to lack of available space.

To better serve the residents of Richland and Freemont Townships in western Saginaw County, a new library building has been planned. Last year, Saginaw Community Foundation awarded \$16,850 in grants to Friends of Rauchholz Memorial Library towards construction of a new facility.

"Receiving support from Saginaw Community
Foundation tells the greater Hemlock community
that others care about Hemlock and its residents," said
Bluemer. "SCF's support shows that this is a community
and a project worth investing in."

The new facility, scheduled to open in 2019, will be a dramatic upgrade. Included in the plans are a large multi-purpose community room, a dedicated children's area, an expanded computer access area, quiet reading areas, and a MakerSpace – complete with STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) programming offerings featuring a 3D printer.

"We're small, but we think big," remarked Bluemer. "That does not discourage us from bringing in resources that might be found in larger library systems. If an opportunity fits our community's needs and will provide a benefit, we will offer it."

The new building, when completed, will continue to help the Rauchholz Memorial Library move beyond the basic expectations of just providing books, to becoming an even greater community hub in the future for generations to come.

The need for skilled workers in local industries is no secret across the Great Lakes Bay Region. Employers are constantly facing shortages of qualified, experienced tradespeople. Thanks in part to grants, two schools in Saginaw County are expanding to train students to meet the growing demands for vocational workers.

Welding

At Merrill Community High School, grants totaling \$18,000 in 2017 will be used to upgrade the ventilation system in the welding lab. Students will be able to receive an American Welding Society (AWS) Limited Level 1 SENSE Certification following the upgrades. It is optional for students to seek this certification, but those that do, the lessons learned and the test completed will get the student half-way to a full Level 1 Certification, thereby saving the student fees for the final testing.

"It is unique for a high school to offer this type of certification," said Rod Kitzmiller, career and college access advisor, Merrill Community High School.

Graduating classes at Merrill Community High School average between 48-50 students. Typically, the welding class has 10-12 students – nearly 20% of the senior student population.

The ventilation upgrades will allow students to work more efficiently and safely. The current set-up does not adequately remove hazardous fumes and other debris from the classroom, often forcing students to weld outside in any weather or temperature. Many times, a large garage door is open during class regardless of the outside temperature.

The new ventilation system will allow for better air flow and make more workstations available, increasing the number of students that can enroll in the class.

MERRILL COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

SAGINAW CAREER COMPLEX

"Our students use real-world tools in class," said Chris Wahl, welding instructor, Merrill Community High School. "Everything they use they will encounter on-the-job when they graduate. We also teach and emphasize safety by establishing a mind-set of safe working. This way our students are better prepared to work in and identify safe working environments post-graduation."

Future plans include possibly expanding the number and types of certifications students can earn before graduating thereby helping to meet the ever-growing need for skilled welders in the Great Lakes Bay Region.

Agricultural Sciences

Meanwhile, across the county in Saginaw, students enrolled in Agricultural Sciences at the Saginaw Career Complex will be adding a new livestock shelter and adding livestock care to the curriculum, thanks to grants awarded by Saginaw Community Foundation totaling \$4,900. Large animal veterinary care has been identified as one of the Michigan Hot 50 career pathway jobs, and in Saginaw County, large animal veterinarians are in dire need.

"There are very few veterinary clinics in the Great Lakes Bay Region able to care for livestock animals," said Joshua Little, principal and CTE director, Saginaw Career Complex. "With the agricultural sciences program offering livestock care, we are exposing students to this career path early-on to gauge their interest and passion in veterinary science."

Currently, the program cares for a handful of chickens, two goats, and one pig. Plans are in the works to add two calves. Up to 46 students are able to participate in the course split over two class sections. Agricultural science students at the Saginaw Career Complex have the opportunity to earn four articulated credits to Michigan State University.

"Part of the success of this program is the partnerships we have in place," said Little. "We have graduate students from Saginaw Valley State University's agriculture program assisting along with local farmers and veterinarians. Our engineering students and building trades students have been involved with the construction of the new shelter, assisting in places where the tasks match the lesson plans in their course of study."

Even with the urban setting of the Saginaw Career Complex, offering an agricultural sciences program is a natural fit.

"Most of Saginaw County is rural," said Little. "We meet the regional needs of the county and the 12 school districts that our students are coming from. Also, we are able to expose students to a career that they might not be otherwise aware of."

Future plans include possible expansion of the agricultural sciences program to include a broader selection of livestock and more horticultural experiences, like growing crops on-site.

"We are thankful for the grant support from Saginaw Community Foundation," said Little. "It lets us know that we are moving in the right direction and that our vision is supported."

train for all

Fifty years ago, the Iberschoff Special, the beloved miniature train at the Children's Zoo at Celebration Square, began its service of delighting young and old with a ride around the perimeter of the zoo. Unfortunately, for those with disabilities, such a ride was challenging or impossible.

Thanks in part to \$74,000 in grants from Saginaw Community Foundation, a project to improve the train was undertaken in 2017. Following guidelines established by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), two new train coaches will be added to the train to allow access for all.

"We want to build bridges and knock down barriers, fostering a sense of self-worth in people with disabilities," said Syndi Thayer, community relationship manager, Children's Zoo at Celebration Square. "Focusing on abilities rather than disabilities, an ADA-certified train coach will help build a foundation of positivity and self-confidence for all."

Many challenges were faced with making a train coach ADA-accessible. If a new coach were purchased, would it match the shape and scale of the current coaches? Luckily, a nearly identical train engine and two coaches were found in the possession of a private owner in Pennsylvania for sale online. They were a little bit newer and painted completely black, but they matched the current train set at the Children's Zoo at Celebration Square.

All of the work done to retro-fit the two acquired coaches to be ADA-compliant was performed by local companies.

"The community supports us and we wanted to support local businesses in return," said Thayer.

This coming summer, the train will pull four coaches (two ADA-compliant and two existing). The train loading and unloading area will be renovated to allow for more efficient line control and designated stroller parking will be added. To accommodate the retro-fitted train coaches better, the direction the train will travel has been reversed.

According to Thayer, this project would not have been possible without the support of the Saginaw Community Foundation. "SCF helped us make connections in the community for additional much needed support. The knowledgeable staff guided us through the grant process and made us aware of a variety of opportunities. The organization is a huge and vital resource for our community."

During the summer of 2018, when the newly retro-fitted train leaves the station for the first time, it will become the first train attraction in the Great Lakes

Bay Region that will be fully ADAcertified. And now, the Children's Zoo at Celebration Square can proudly exclaim: "all aboard!"



neighborly

Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD) is regarded as one of the leading methods of improving communities and neighborhoods. The process encourages community members to start with what they have instead of what they need. Rather than turning to outsiders for help, ABCD principles empower neighbors to make change from within by identifying assets and making connections between them.



As part of a pilot program, Saginaw Community Foundation (SCF) selected the newly-formed Unity in the Community Neighborhood Association to participate in an ABCD program. The neighborhood, located on Saginaw's East Side between Perkins St. and E. Holland Ave. and E. Genesee Ave. and S. 23rd St., will be anchored at The Saginaw County Community Action Center (CAC), 2824 Perkins St.

"For SCF to continue to be effective in achieving our mission, we must look at new ways, like ABCD, to impact change within our community in addition to our traditional model of grant funding," said Brian Jackson, director of donor services & special initiatives at Saginaw Community Foundation.

Beginning in 2015, SCF sent representatives from its Community Improvement Initiative/ABCD Committee to several neighborhood association meetings across the City of Saginaw to "be neighborly", to listen, and to look for ways to connect. In September 2017, SCF held an informational meeting inviting representatives from the neighborhood associations to learn about the ABCD process. At the meeting, neighborhoods were encouraged to apply to be part of a pilot program where SCF selected a neighborhood to be trained in the ABCD principles.

"Our goal is to provide sustainable development of Saginaw County communities based on their strengths and potentials," said Jackson. "We want to work with neighborhood residents to form relationships and empower citizens to take action."

ABCD is a place-based framework that can help build strong, safe, and healthy neighborhoods and communities. By bringing the community together and focusing on the gifts within, ABCD helps residents, associations, nonprofits, government, and the business community, to act collectively as co-producers of their neighborhood's well-being.

"We are excited to be chosen to participate in this pilot program," said Lillie Williams-Grays, executive director of Saginaw CAC and a neighborhood representative for Unity in the Community Neighborhood Association. "Long-term, we hope the ABCD process will help to build

a stronger sense of neighborhood pride as we get to know our neighbors and the resources they each can offer."

Getting Started

In December 2017, a holiday potluck was held at the Saginaw CAC as part of the first ABCD meeting with Unity in the Community. Members of the neighborhood attended as well as leadership from other neighborhood associations in Saginaw. Jeff Bookmyer, ABCD Trainer/Facilitator, has been brought on-board to lead the ABCD process with Unity in the Community.

One of the first tasks was breaking the group into pairs. Each person interviewed the other to talk about the community and to help build an Asset Inventory. An Asset Inventory is a listing of interests (assets) for the neighborhood. Of those in attendance: 21 were interested in community involvement, 11 enjoy gardening, 12 like to cook/bake, three were handy with home improvement projects, and three know how to sew.

"The purpose of developing an Asset Inventory is to make neighbors aware of each other's talents," said Bookmyer. "This way, they have an inventory of a person to contact if they need help with a particular activity or if they want to connect with others to build relationships or to work on a project together."

Moving Forward

SCF will provide a comprehensive ABCD training for representatives of the Unity in the Community Neighborhood Association over the coming months and will help guide the neighborhood to a successful outcome. Goals for 2018 include establishing a mission statement and bylaws, create a logo for the neighborhood association, and elect officers.

"Strong, safe, and healthy neighborhoods and communities are built on the strengths and capacities of their residents and associations that call the community home," said Reneé Johnston, president and CEO of Saginaw Community Foundation. "ABCD will allow residents, with help and guidance from SCF, to discover their talents and make connections to improve and strengthen their neighborhood from within."

improvement in action

On Saginaw's East Side, an amazing transformation is happening in one neighborhood. A transformation that is beginning to bear fruit ... literally.

"We're the best kept secret in Saginaw!" exclaims Jim Shafley, pastor and president of Kingdom Builder's Ministry.

Since 2012, Kingdom Builder's Ministry has been serving young men who are unemployed or underemployed by teaching marketable job skills in construction trades and agriculture. The Ministry buys abandoned houses and remodels them as well as buying vacant lots to create urban farming plots full of apple and peach trees. They also support several honey bee hives.

Kingdom Builder's Ministry operates out of the Kingdom Center, 346 S. 9th St., Saginaw (site of the former Trinity Lutheran School) purchased in 2014 for \$1 from the Saginaw County Land Bank. Kingdom Builders and has worked to renovate the building which serves as its

headquarters, sanctuary, classroom instruction space, construction mock-up learning lab, and commercial-grade kitchen for honey processing.

In 2017 at Saginaw Community Foundation's Annual Celebration in Morley Plaza, Kingdom Builder's Ministry was announced as the recipient of the 2017 Community Improvement Initiative Grant. The \$25,000 grant will be used to support the ongoing efforts of the Ministry and its program. An additional \$5,000 was recently earned as a result of Kingdom Builder's Ministry matching the initial grant amount.

Making a difference

The construction trades program is led by Shafley, a licensed builder and construction project manager. Jim works with up to five individuals teaching full-trades training in vinyl siding/windows and doors, hardwood/tile flooring, trim work, plumbing, HVAC, drywall/painting, building walls/internal framing, installing cabinets and electric.

"Participants in the program are referred to us by the Michigan Department of Corrections and also the City Rescue Mission of Saginaw," says Shafley. "Individuals that our partner agencies feel would be a good fit are sent our way."

After classroom instruction and construction lab exercises, the participants head-out into the field to work on the homes purchased by the Ministry for remodeling. Aside from classroom and hands-on learning, life skills are also taught.

"We teach participants how to respond to life with emotions such as humility, compassion and trust," said Shafley.
"So, not only will they learn technical skills, they will also be taught how to best handle tough situations in life."

Shafley adds that jobs are often lost because a person cannot arrive on time, does not work hard while on the job, or has excessive absences. The tough situations of the participant's lives have significant impact on these factors. The Ministry teaches them how to respond to life with new emotions and in a rational manner.

"Some of our participants are on parole," adds Shafley.
"We know that returning citizens and ex-offenders
have the most challenging times finding employment.
Kingdom Builder's believes that by completing one of our
programs, participants will have the skills and knowledge
to be gainfully employed."

Planting Seeds

Besides construction trade skill instruction, Kingdom Builder's Ministry also teaches agriculture skills with its apple and peach orchards and honey bee hives. Orchards are located on the corner of Annesley and Hosmer Streets and on Burt Street between S. 13th and S. 14th Streets. Currently, Kingdom Builder's owns and maintains 31 lots with 17 containing fruit tree plantings.

"This spring, we will be planting 150 trees on newly cleared lots," said Shafley. "Our goal is to have 700 trees planted within the next four years."

Plans are in place to begin selling fruit from the orchards and honey processed from the bee hives at the Downtown Saginaw Farmers' Market located at the new SVRC Marketplace. Fresh baked goods are also in the works.

Changing Lives

By June this year, five participants will have successfully completed the program. It's challenging for both Shafely and the participants.

"Commitment is hard for those that have made poor choices in life and served time in prison," says Shafely.
"Participants say they will be committed but find it hard to remain committed after pledging to do so. We become a positive role model in their lives."

One of Kingdom Builder's past participants has moved on to regular employment with a local honey producer. Shafley says: "When this young man arrived, I asked him if he likes heights. He said, 'no'. Then I asked him if likes bees and he also said, 'no'. Well, he grew to enjoy the honey and the bees and now he works out in St. Charles. He turned his life around."

Kingdom Builder's Ministry emphasizes teaching patience and empathy. Shafely reflects: "Impulsive emotions have ruled their lives. We teach them how to control their emotions. We teach them life skills that many of us take for granted."

"When participants leave our program, they will have been taught strong work ethics, marketable skills, financial management, social skills, responsibility, and accountability," said Shafley. "We don't dwell on the past. We focus on the future."






















Net Annual Returns
