



# SCF receives \$350K grant to aid in fight against violent crime

#### Project Safe Neighborhood grant renewed for additional three years

A \$348,836 federal grant, awarded to the Saginaw Community Foundation through the U.S. Department of Justice's Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) program. It will be used by a law enforcement and a community task force to reduce violent gang and gun crime in Saginaw. The grant will also support anti-drug and anti-gang instruction for students in the Saginaw Public School district.

The grant award was announced at a press conference at SCF on Oct. 7. Congressman Dan Kildee, Saginaw Police Department Chief Robert Ruth, Saginaw Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Ramont Roberts, Saginaw County Prosecuting Attorney John McColgan, and SCF President & CEO Reneé Johnston were in attendance.

"Every Saginaw resident deserves to feel safe in their neighborhood. This federal grant will help reduce violent crime and make our community a safer place to live," Congressman Kildee said.

Launched two decades ago as an evidence-based and community-oriented response to serious gun crime, PSN is a key component of the U.S. Department of Justice's Comprehensive Strategy for Reducing Violent Crime. The PSN approach is guided by four key principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities; supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place; setting focused and strategic enforce-

ment priorities; and measuring the results of our efforts. The fundamental goal is to reduce violent crime, not simply to increase the number of arrests or prosecutions.

Dawn Ison, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan, whose division oversees the implementation of Project Safe Neighborhoods in Saginaw, says: "Saginaw has the opportunity to greatly improve the quality of life for the residents of Saginaw who are most acutely affected by gun violence. This award is great news for Saginaw as it will provide the funding needed to help reach our goal of reducing gun violence."

According to Dr. Ramont Roberts, the awarding of the PSN grant will allow Saginaw Public Schools to continue support the socio-emotional needs of its students as well as their safety. "We look forward to our

partnership with local law enforcement officials to ensure that violence is reduced in the city and perhaps, more importantly, working together proactively by equipping our young men and women with the skills that will allow them to make sound decisions educationally and socially."

"The Saginaw Community Foundation is excited and honored to not only be awarded this opportunity, but also to work closely again with the Saginaw Police Department, other law enforcement departments and community partners who are committed to making the City of Saginaw a safe community. We appreciate Congressman Kildee's continued support for our work and our community," said Reneé Johnston, president and CEO, Saginaw Community Foundation. "Since we have previously been awarded this grant opportunity, and experienced

## New funds established

The following new funds were approved by the SCF Board of Directors between June 18 – Oct. 14, 2022:

#### Dr. Scott Amman Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship to be awarded to one Chesaning Union School's graduating high school senior who is pursuing a career in STEM or Career and Technical Education field. The scholarship is established in honor of the donor's late husband, who was an electrical engineer with a passion for mentoring the next generation of STEM and Career and Technical Education professionals. It will award \$500 annually.

#### Dan Liebrock Basketball Scholarship

\$500 scholarships to be awarded to two graduating high school seniors (one male, one female) who have participated in high school basketball for at least two years. This scholarship is established in honor of the donor's late husband, who was employed as a basketball coach in the Hemlock Public School District.

#### Gerald & Inez O'Brien Scholarship

Scholarship fund established in memory of Gerald and Inez by their children. Annually, a \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a high school graduating student in the Great Lakes Bay Region.

#### Marjorie A. Orr Scholarship

This scholarship will annually award two scholarships at \$1,250 each, to students pursuing a medical-related field-of-study, including nursing, medical school and pharmacy school.

#### Frank Rios, Jr. Line Worker Scholarship

A scholarship to be awarded to an individual studying to be an Electrical Line worker. This scholarship is established in honor of Frank who worked for Consumers Energy as a line worker.

tremendous positive change to violent activity, I'm looking forward to further addressing crime and violence with this additional funding."

A task force of local, state and federal partners will use the grant to identify gang and gun crime hotspots in specific neighborhoods, enhance the Saginaw Public School District's School Resource Officer program to provide anti-drug and anti-gang instruction and build community trust, and develop a violence interruption program.

Task force partners include the Saginaw Police Department, Michigan State Police, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, U.S. Attorney's Office, Michigan Department of Corrections, Saginaw County Prosecutor's Office, the Saginaw Public School District and community partners.

"This will help the Saginaw Police Department and its partners reduce the incidents of violent crime in the Saginaw region," Chief Ruth said. "This will help ensure a safer environment for everyone who lives, works and plays in the city of Saginaw."
