Your fund will be endowed at the Saginaw Community Foundation. Earnings gained through investments will be used to make grants that address needs in Saginaw County. If you prefer, grants can be made anonymously.

### Field of Interest

Administered by the foundation to benefit a general field of interest

### Scholarship

Provides financial support for students seeking higher education

### Unrestricted

Administered by the foundation to meet the urgent and changing needs in Saginaw County

Since awarding our first \$500 scholarship in 1987, the Saginaw Community Foundation has awarded college scholarships to area students totaling more than \$9.9 million, thanks to our generous donors. Each year, over 300 college-bound or career and technical education students benefit from our scholarship awards.

#### No essay required

Applicants will now complete a questionnaire within the application where students will respond with brief answers.

*Note: Some SCF scholarships will require special essays. Instructions will be provided in the application.*

#### No letters of recommendation

Applicants will identify one person to complete an online recommendation form.

#### FAFSA Student Aid Index (SAI) not required

SAI attachments are not needed in order to determine financial need for scholarships with a financial need component.





# Endowment Funds De-Mystified

Endowment funds managed by Saginaw Community Foundation are one of the best ways to support your community. The term “endowment fund” can be a mystery for some or sound like a complicated idea – even though it’s a way to make giving personal, impactful, and powerful to benefit Saginaw County and beyond ... *for good, forever.*

## What is an Endowment?

An endowment is a tool for donors to support charitable entities and causes that matter to them most – not just today, but forever. At its core, an endowment fund is a type of invested charitable fund creating a steady resource that continues for generations to come, while guaranteeing that the principal will always remain intact and growth occurs ... *forever.*

## How Does an Endowment Work?

There is a common misconception that SCF’s endowments are comprised of all spendable funds, used for anything at any time. However, the principal of an endowment fund is never spent. Earnings, or the interest gained, are used to make grants that meet community needs. An endowment fund can grow over time to generate an increasing stream

of funding devoted to a specific interest area or to broadly support our community. As the principal fund balance grows, so does the spendable portion of an endowment fund.

Using a 12-quarter rolling average of the fund balances, SCF typically makes 5% of the fund balance available for granting purposes each year. The principal balance of an endowment fund must be at minimum levels (\$10,000 or \$20,000 for scholarships) before granting of funds is permitted.

By preserving the principal balance of an endowed fund, the fund becomes a permanent source of community benefit – growing over time – *for good, forever.*

## How are SCF’s Endowment Funds Used?

Many funds at SCF have been established with allowable restrictions to support specific goals as stipulated by the donor. These types of funds include **scholarships** (*supporting post-secondary education or other educational opportunities for students*), **designated** (*supporting a specific named charitable entity*), or **donor advised** (*allows a donor to recommend a contribution to a charitable entity they wish to support*).

Even though these endowment funds are managed, invested and reported with SCF’s assets, the available dollars in each endowment fund have specified restrictions as mentioned previously and cannot be directed

towards anything else. Fund types that allow SCF to award grants on a quarterly basis are unrestricted and field of interest funds.

## Why Establish an Endowment Fund?

SCF Endowment Funds provide intangible benefits. They are a perfect way to benefit the community forever and create a lasting legacy supporting a specific charitable cause. Many nonprofit agencies in Saginaw County have created an endowment fund at SCF. Those agencies have a source of funding that can provide financial security, allowing them to strengthen their own operations or take on new challenges as they arise.

Not all endowment funds at SCF are established to address social challenges. Some endowment funds help increase the quality of life through access to arts, culture, recreation, or educational enrichment opportunities. Regardless of the purpose of an endowment fund, it will play a sustaining and potentially transformational role in our community for generations to come – *forever.*
